# HISTORY

OF THE VICTORY CLUB...

Alpha Delta Phi's Victory Club reaches back in time over seventy years to the First World War, when fraternity members organized a gambling club to raise money for a Victory Loan drive in 1918. Entrance to the club was by the purchase of one or more Victory Bonds.

Driven underground by Prohibition in 1919, Victory Club flourished as a speakeasy and developed its present extravagant character during those roaring Twenties. Over the past seventy years Victory Club varied in size, frequency, and exclusivity, but finally re-emerged in the late seventies with a legal gambling license.

Philanthropy, gambling, champagne, black tie, and serious fun: these foundations have remained constant for over seventy years, and contribute to the enduring reputation of the Victory Club Charity Ball as the "Best Party in the Ivy League."




# Our Charities

# ITHACA REFUGEE PROGRAM LITERACY FUND

To establish a library of single copy texts for instruction, consumable work books, and true literacy materials for instruction in English as a second language. The library being created with your donation is unique in Ithaca and will benefit the area for years to come. Ithaca is home to a surprisingly large population of refugees including Vietnamese, Laotian, Cambodian, Afghan, and most recently, Russian immigrants for whom the Refugee Assistance Center volunteer instructors teach classes five days a week. # The Games...

9pm to 2am

All Gaming Rules are established by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board:

### General Rules

•Anyone found cheating will be kicked out of the event, and subject to Fines, Imprisonment, or Both.

•All monies won by the House are donated to Charity.

 Chips may be purchased only at the Cashier Banks.

Liquor is not allowed in the gambling areas.
 Maximum single bet is two dollars.
 Any disputes will be ultimately settled by the Gaming Chairman, David Frain.
 Players are responsible for keeping track of their own bets.

## Black Jack "21"

- •BLACKJACK is an Ace and any face card or 10 (on the first two cards dealt).
- •House wins all ties except Blackjack which is a push.
- •All bets pay 1:1 except Blackjack which pays 2:1.
- · Any out-of-order dealing will result in a misdeal.
  - •Doubling down is allowed after first two cards only, at which time the player notifies the dealer by doubling his bet and saying "doubling down." The player receives only one additional card.
- •Splitting pairs is allowed on first two cards only Player must notify the dealer by doubling his bet and saying "split." Player draws on one card until completed, then proceeds to draw on the second card. You can NOT WIN BLACKJACK when you split. All winners are paid 1:1. If you split aces, you receive only one additional card for each hand (no possible blackjacks)
- No Insurance bets allowed
- ·All player cards are dealt face up.

## Lucky Arrows

•Players may bet on horse numbers 1 to 13.

•Bets must be placed clearly inside the lines.

•Players receive one chip for each arrow landing on their selected horse.

•Players may not add or remove bets once wheel is spun.

•Do not pick up bets until all bets are paid off.

### Roulette

•No bets may be added or removed once ball is released.

•The following bets are allowed and payoffs are as follows:

-One number bet...26:1

-Two number bet...13:1

-Four corner bet...6:1

-One line bet...10:1

-Two lines bet...5:1

-Column bet...2:1

-Low, Middle or High bet...2:1

-Odd, Even, Black, or Red bet...1:1

•Bets should be clearly placed on tables so dealers know exactly what bets the player desires.

•Definition of bets available at Roulette tables

•Players are responsible for remembering their own bets. Any arguments will be resolved by splitting the pot among those who claim ownership.

# Big Nine Wheel

- •No bets may be added or removed once Wheel is spun.
- Bets may be placed on numbers 1 through nine as well as on hearts, diamonds, or clubs.
- •All number bets pay One chip for as many times as that number shows up on the Wheel. For example, if the wheel lands on a space with three nines and two fours, then 9's pay 3:1 and fours pay 2:1.
- •Players are paid 10:1 if the wheel lands on their suit.

Money Wheel

- •No bets may be added or removed once Wheel is spun.
- •Bets may be placed on any dollar amount, the Joker, or the Flag.
- ·Flag and Joker bets pay 25:1.
- •Dollar bets pay that denomination e.g. \$20 bill pays 20:1.
- If spin stops between two spaces, that spin is considered a miss-spin.
